Bill Nessmith

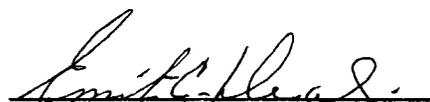
Hub Powell with the Probation Office came before the Board and requested the County's payment of their phone bill every month. The matter was tabled for further consideration.

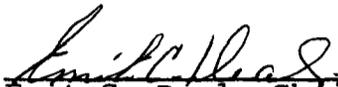
Mrs. Pearl Deal was appointed as Tax Assessor for a six year term beginning January 1, 1979 ending January 1, 1985.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE

Subsection (4) on page 3 of the County Ordinance is stricken out, and re-written as follows:

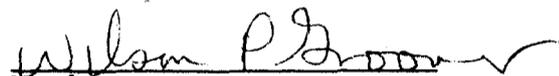
(4) Dealers in malt beverages or wine, or both, for on premises consumption, for 18 hours, that is, from 6:00 o'clock a. m. to 12:00 o'clock midnight on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week, from 6:00 o'clock, a. m. to 11:30 o'clock p. m., (17 1/2 hrs.) on Saturday of each week. Premises where malt beverages or wine, or both, are sold must be vacated by the public at midnight Saturday night and remained closed to and unoccupied by the public for the next six hours, until 6:00 o'clock, a. m., on Sunday, when said premises may be re-opened to the public for business other than sale of malt beverages or wine, or both.

The sale of malt beverages or wine, or both, shall be and is prohibited for the full 24 hours of Sundays, New Years Day, 4th of July, Thanksgiving and Christmas, in addition to the other closing times indicated above.

On election days, sales of malt beverages or wines, or both, shall be permitted starting one hour after the official time of closing the polls or otherwise as required or permitted by State Law of Georgia. Dealers for off-premises consumption of malt beverages, or wine, or both, shall be governed by the foregoing sale hours, but not by the closing requirements.

The Bulloch County Board of Commissioners met on the above date in the Commissioner's Office with all members present. Rev. Elmer Golden, Jr. gave the invocation.

Jerry Hancock of the Soil Conservation Service came before the Board requesting that the County pay for the phone bill for their office. Due to the fact that other offices have requested similar reimbursements, the Board felt that they could not fill this request without filling all others.

Rev. Elmer Golder came before the Board in behalf of the Sheriff's Office requesting improved salaries and increased personnel for the Sheriff's Office.

Mr. George Hanson and Mr. Ray Hendley met with the Board to request approval of a resolution presented by the Downtown Development Authority. Said legislation introduced into the General Assembly would establish an official Downtown Development Authority. The Board approved the resolution.

The County approved a resolution prepared by the Department of Transportation to establish a speed zone in the Country Club Area.

The Board approved the pre-application for a Community Development Block Grant for grading and paving of roads in the Whitesville area. Motion was made by Mr. Ellis, seconded by Mr. Groover.

The Ogeechee Judicial Circuit Judge's Budget of \$4040.00 was approved for 1979.

The Board voted not to accept any more sub-division roads for maintenance until a new set of regulations governing such roads can be established.

Upon receipt of a request from the Sheriff for two new cars, the Board will accept bids for the purchase of the two cars.

Chairman Deal announced that the Beautification Commission had requested special blinking lights for the trees in front of the Courthouse. The Board felt that since the remainder of the present project had not been completed, that it would be best to complete it before going on to something else.

Mr. Frank Proctor and Mr. Cohen Anderson requested a road to be deeded to the County for maintenance at the County Landing on the banks of the Ogeechee River. The Board tabled this until new County regulations could be drawn up.

Mr. Floyd Bragg also requested the County take over the roads in his project on South 301. This was also tabled pending the new County regulations.

The Board appointed Mr. Harry Jones, Mayor of Brooklet to fill the unexpired term of the late Joe Ingram, former Mayor, to the APDC Board.

Upon a request from the Library Board, the Commissioners extended all

terms of office for the Library Board for two years beyond each members appointment or for the period of time in which the new library is being constructed.

The Board also appointed William C. Cromley, Jr. to the Board for the years of 1979 and 1980.

Upon resignation of Edwin P. Akins, (architect for the Library) the County Commissioners nominated William J. Neville for the years 1979 and 1980.

The Board approved a lumber conveyor for the Sheppard Lumber Co. The conveyor will be placed over the County road.

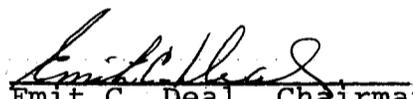
The Board passed a resolution enabling the Altamaha Area Community Action Inc., to file a request with the Georgia Department of Transportation for a capital grant to assist in the purchase of equipment to provide transportation service to the elderly and handicapped. The County will not be responsible for maintenance and operation of the equipment.

The Board turned down an offer of assistance from Fort Stewart to clean up Whitesville due to the expenses involved and the work being done on private property.

The Board endorses House Bill 185, the Public Defender Bill, currently before legislature.

The possible updating of the County Computer L5000 to an L9000 was discussed. The matter was tabled until all information could be obtained as to programming cost, etc.

Altman Pontiac was the low bidder on a trade in of two cars for the Sheriff's Department as follows:

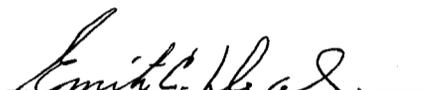

Therefore, be it resolved that this Board emphatically condemns such material being kept, distributed or shown and commends all good citizens to do likewise, to the end that same be brought to a stop, under law.

Unanimously approved by the Board, April 17, 1979.

Chairman Deal announced that several midtown public parking lot owners had requested the taxes be removed from their lot. The Board decided to leave the decision with the Tax Assessor's Office since they are in charge of taxation in the County.

Upon discussion of the need for updating the County computer from an L5000 to an L9000, the Board decided that it would be necessary to update

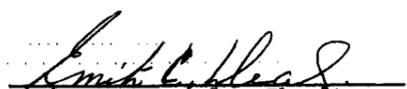
the present computer purchased in January of 1973. The trade in difference is \$13,200.00.

Arnold Ray Akins and representatives of Motorola met with the Board to discuss the maintenance on the Sheriff's Department and Jail radios, etc. The Board decided to purchase the 24 hour maintenance contract at a price of \$211.45 per month.

The Board is also accepting bids on a Sheriff's Car to replace a 1977 Pontiac. The Board discussed the needed repairs to the Courthouse steeple, etc. The Board agreed to consider bids from other sources in addition to one presented by Mr. William Justice.

Mr. Bob Dearman requested help from the County to help build a Humane Shelter for animals in the County. The Board tabled this for further consideration.

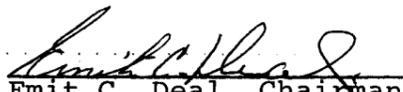
The Library requested the County to include the personnel at the Library in the County Workmen's Compensation program. The Board did not feel that the Library should be included in the County policy.

The ITT Trucking firm requested the leasing of a portion of land belonging to the Camp. The Board agreed to lease the land if an agreement can be reached with the trucking firm.

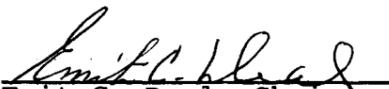
The Board agreed to purchase Console Radio equipment for \$3500.00 for the Sheriff's Department.

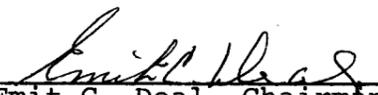
The Board agreed to participate in the paving on the streets in Brooklet. The County agreed to pay 50% of the remaining cost of State Grant and contract price.

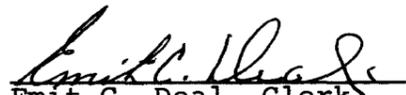
WHEREAS, this Board further considers that any such act would violate the equal protection entitlements of Bulloch County under the constitution of the State of Georgia, and of the United States.

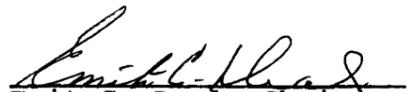
The Georgia State Patrol requested the County's purchasing a new radar system for the Station. The Board decided not to purchase it at this time.

AN ORDINANCE OF
Bulloch County

Persuant to Georgia Code, Title 68A, Section 1502 and Section 68A-1001 through Section 68A-1004 of that title known as the Uniform Rules of the Road, and upon the basis of the report and recommendation of the District Traffic and Safety Engineer, the Commissioners of Bulloch County Georgia, finds that the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles within the areas of the County Road system described in said report is dangerous to those using the highway and unduly interferes with the free movement of traffic thereon, and

It is ordered by the Commissioners of Bulloch County, Georgia, under the authority aforesaid, that the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles is prohibited within the limits of said areas described as follows:

That segment of roadway on County Road 236 beginning at County Road 243 continuing northerly on County Road 236 to the Statesboro City Limits a distance of 0.4 mile, both sides of roadway.

Signs to be erected by Bulloch County.

Be it resolved that any person convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished as provided for by law.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance shall be repealed.

This ordinance shall become effective when appropriate signs are erected.

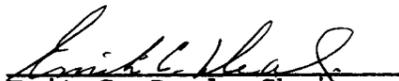
The invocation was given by Chairman Deal.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned, subject to call.

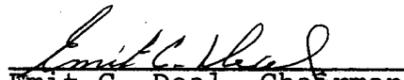
