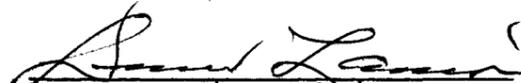

A discussion was held on an additional salary for Sherri Akins, Clerk of Court. Due to a 1973 ruling, Clerks handling State Courts are entitled to an extra \$100 per month. The Board agreed to retroactively pay Mrs. Akins \$100 per month for State Court back to January 1, 1981, the beginning of her term of office.

Judge Francis Allen met with the Board in reference to the property behind Pizza Inn. He advised the Board that the property originally belonged to Mrs. Pearl Deal. The Board agreed to have the deeds searched and obtain a decision from the County attorney in order to establish a ruling.

A Committee of three representing the Bulloch Alcohol and Drug Abuse Council met with the Board to give a report and to make the community aware of "Soberfest", a special week set aside for alcohol awareness and abstention, beginning February 5, 1983.

Chairman Lanier read a letter from the Bar Association regarding the County's proposed purchase of microfilming equipment. The Bar requested additional vault space for the Clerk's Office plus disapproval of microfilming for the Clerk's Office.

The Board, upon discussion, did agree to purchase a microfilming unit from Bell and Howell for \$11,797.90. The Commissioners felt that the microfilming was necessary for the protection of County records.

The Board, upon discussion, agreed to a 5% salary increase for legislatively covered County employees (see attached resolution). Said raise to be effective upon legislative approval.

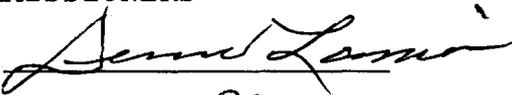

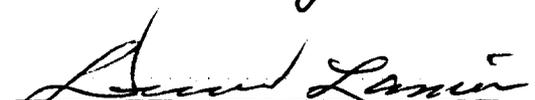
WHEREAS, this Commission was established to assist local governments in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating sound areawide development.

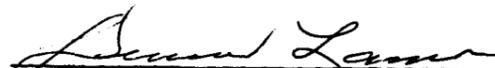

Mr. Lanier reported that Candler County had requested aid on the Langsford Bridge on County Road #65. The Board decided to seek further input from Candler County before making a decision on the matter.

The Commissioners from Screven County requested assistance on the Rocky Ford Bridge. The Screven Commissioners were planning to ask assistance from the Department of Transportation on the expense of the bridge before a figure could be worked out between the two Counties.

The Commissioners signed a resolution authorizing the Department of Transportation to base and pave the Pretoria Station Road, a distance of 1.397 miles.

Mr. Lanier also read a letter from Libba Smith inviting the Commissioners to an Arbor Day service and tree-planting ceremony commemorating the 250th birthday of Georgia at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, February 18, 1983, on the grounds of the Bulloch County Courthouse.

Chairman Lanier discussed House Bill 121 - J. P. Magistrate Bill.

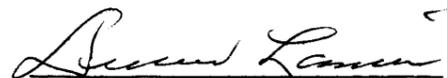

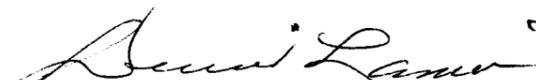
The Commissioners upon discussion, agreed to request bids on a Bush Hog Mower for the County Road system.

Upon proper motion and second, the Georgia Residential Housing Authority Plan for low rent housing was approved for Bulloch County.

Chairman Lanier announced that W. M. Phillips had been named by the State Department of Family and Children Services to the Bulloch County Board of Family and Children Services for a term beginning July 1, 1983, expiring June 30, 1988.

the City of Statesboro in the widening of Williams Road for better accessibility for the school children, etc. in that area. The City/County will pay \$7,000.00 each in addition to the State's participation.

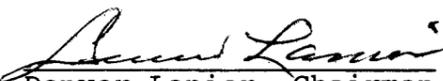
The Commissioners, after proper motion, second and approval, voted to adopt the County budget at \$3,572,422.74 for the 1983-84 fiscal year.

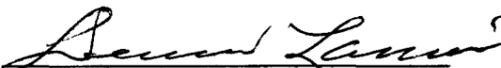

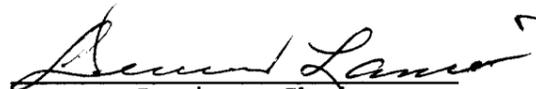
The Commissioners met with Mr. Tom Moreland with the D.O.T. in Atlanta along with Mr. McKenzie, Billy Williams, Bo Davis and representatives Godbee and Lane, at the D.O.T. office on 301 North to discuss Bulloch County road projects. Mr. Moreland agreed to base and pave the 1 mile of Mill Creek Mobile Home Estates Road and both segments of the Preetoria Road. Contract to be let in August, 1983, with paving possibly delayed until Spring of 1984. Mr. Moreland informed us that we could get almost twice as many roads surfaced if we would base them as they were constructed. The County is seriously considering this on the next construction project.

The names discussed for the Bulloch County Development Authority at the July 7, meeting were confirmed and their term of office named. They are as follows:
