Declaration of Judicial Emergency)

ORDER

The undersigned Chief Judge of Superior Court for the Ogeechee Judicial Circuit of Georgia does hereby declare the existence of a judicial emergency in this circuit. The nature of this emergency is due to Hurricane Michael which is expected to affect this judicial circuit on October 10, 2018 through October 11, 2018. The undersigned makes this declaration in conformance with the Order by Governor Nathan Deal of the existence of a state of emergency in Bulloch, Effingham, Screven, and Jenkins counties issued on October 9, 2018.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that all Court business in Superior and Juvenile Courts for Bulloch County will be closed for business on Wednesday, October 10, 2018, at 12:00 p.m. and will reopen for business on Friday, October 12, 2018, at the regular time.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, all Court business in Superior and Juvenile Courts for Screven County will be closed for business on Thursday, October 11, 2018, and will reopen for business on Friday, October 12, 2018, at the regular time.

Given the uncertain nature or duration of this emergency, the Court hereby suspends, tolls, extends, and otherwise grants relief from all deadlines or other time schedules of filing requirements imposed by otherwise applicable statutes, rules, regulations, or court orders, whether in civil or criminal cases or administrative matters, including, but not limited to:

- 1. A statute of limitation;
- 2. The time within which to issue a warrant;
- 3. The time within which to try a case for which demand for speedy trial has been filed;
- 4. The time within which to hold a commitment hearing;
- 5. A deadline or other schedule regarding the detention of a juvenile;
- 6. The time within which to return a bill in indictment or an accusation or to bring a matter before a grand jury;
- 7. The time within which to file a writ of habeas corpus;

- 8. The time within which discovery or any aspect thereof is to be completed;
- 9. The time within which to serve a party;
- 10. The time within which to appeal or to seek the right to appeal any order, ruling, or other determination; and
- 11. And such other legal proceedings as may be determined to be necessary;

for the duration of the time of closing set forth herein.

Because the Court expects all public buildings within the Counties of Bulloch and Screven to be closed for an indeterminate period of time, the Court is unable to designate another facility for the transaction of court business. Should the State of Emergency extend beyond the closure period indicated above, the Court will make a determination of an available, appropriate facility for the conduct of court business when it is appropriate to do so.
